Mentors attending Launch Weekend


- We request Mentor support, to assist all teams, to achieve safe and successful flights
- Friday Workshop
 - We will need support in Avionics Workshop
 - Examine and troubleshoot teams avionics
 - We will reach out to a few to supplement the team
 - Goal is to have all avionics issues cleared on Friday to expedite Saturday launch prep
- Saturday Launch
 - Mentors are responsible for preparing their team for launch (ensuring proper sequence of steps – we will provide charges and motors)
 - After the team is prepped, your Challenge Lead will sign off the Flight Card prior to the team moving to RSO
 - After your team has flown, we ask Mentors to assist other teams to safely get to the pads as we have around 30 teams trying to launch



Competition Launch Day Expectations

- There are a few WSGC items to observe on Launch Day
 - Launch site opens at 7:30 am
 - Kick-off/Safety Meeting at RSO table at 8:00 am
 - Pre-launch group/team photo with Steve Janiak, photographer
 - Video/photos throughout the day for WSGC media purposes
 - Team members wear FNL T-Shirt at launch site
 - Lanyards identify which advisors/team members are not a TRA/NAR member, limiting access to launch area
 - Only 3 individuals from each team may go to the launch pad (Advisor/2 students)
 - Individuals aged 12-17 must be accompanied by a TRA/NAR member of the same motor impulse being launched
 - Individuals may conduct certification launches after their team completes the competition launch, if time permits. Competition launches take precedence.
 - Individuals conducting certification launch should notify Connie prior to launch weekend
 - All teams must be cleared by the pit crew before going to the RSO table
 - When you a cleared by the pit crew, your launch card will receive a signature or sticker







TRA/NAR Membership – Past Due

Important Launch Weekend Information

- All attending team members and advisors should be active members of TRA or NAR organization (insurance requirement)

- Any team that has not submitted TRA/NAR info may not be able to launch without proof of membership.



Post Launch Expectations

- Before you leave the launch site:
 - Teams are also expected to submit:
 - Altimeter Data
 - Jump Drives will be provided during registration that we ask the team to copy their altimeter data onto and turn in at WSGC table or your Challenge Lead
- Post Launch Assessment Report (PLAR)
 - Due May 12th
 - Summary of vehicle performance, challenge performance and comparison to predictions – share lessons learned

Advisors

Stipend breakout

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Reimbursements

- Reimbursements are determined by your award document
- Verify the method selected, we must receive an email from the advisor of record to change the reimbursement method
 - Reimbursement to Organization (School or Student Organization)
 - Requires Institutional W-9 sent in
 - Reimbursement to individuals
 - Individual W-9 required in following situations:
 - All advisors that are receiving stipends
 - Students that win competition awards (i.e., Patch Contest)
